

## **Producing the Nation's Best Through Equitable Integrated Instruction (EII)**

- Each school will select content area teachers who will receive training in ESL methodology and strategies. They will also be provided with textbooks that contain the appropriate content, but at a lower reading level than the state adopted text. The teacher will utilize both texts. The EII classroom should have the same materials as a mainstream class, plus additional materials provided by the Multilingual Department as a supplement.
- EII classes will be offered for the following courses:
  - \* Algebra 1
  - \* Geometry
  - \* World Geography
  - \* World History
  - \* IPC
  - \* Biology
  - \*EII Reading
  - \*EII Chemistry
- The majority of students in the EII classroom will be immigrant students in their second or third year in the country. The remainder should be students who are reading below grade level and who would benefit from the strategies and materials that will be utilized in the EII classroom. They may be mainstreamed students, or ESL students who are no longer immigrants, however those students should be carefully screened to determine that EII is the appropriate placement. ELI (English Language Institute) or Special Education students will not be included in the EII classroom. ELI students may be placed in EII math courses. Due to the special needs of students acquiring English, care needs to be taken in placing students with discipline issues.
